and that. "You have a responsibility to give back your talents to help others learn and grow with FFA," she said. "I challenge you to give back all you have to offer to FFA."

As a state FFA officer, she spoke of the challenges of working with "11 different people with 11 different backgrounds and 11 different management styles" as a group and how it grew into a state team.

Ogline praised FFA, which gave her the skills to speak about agriculture to the public through her work with the conservation district. "I cannot imagine a better hands-on leadership setting in which to develop yourself personally," she said.

Ogline presented memories of her FFA membership, including the time when she glimpsed the "24,000 fellow black and gold jackets at Kansas City." She recalled friendships she made, including an FFA member from Missouri with whom she regularly calls and writes.

"FFA friendships," said Ogline, "can last a lifetime."
