issue, because connected to the registration is a deadline for the chemicals and there is not enough time to allow for the development of new chemicals or same or lesser cost treatments to achieve the same crop production.

He said that all of the products were to have been reviewed by the end of May (1998) and be finalized for registration by August 1999. There are no new products online to replace the chemicals currently

What it means is that a number of widely used crop protection chemicals will be disallowed, denying farmers the ability to protect their crops.

These proven chemicals make food more healthy and bountiful. They are major contributors to safe food and less expensive food," according to PFB.

"Most field crops and some garden crops in Pennsylvania would suffer immensely if these chemi-

cals are eliminated. The price for all food would increase dramatically, because there is no inexpensive substitute for these chemicals."

Local Tax Reform

Along with many other groups, the PFB for years has been calling upon state legislators to come together and work hard for local tax reforms.

What the PFB seeks is to move away from the real estate tax as the main funding source of school districts, and shift to a menu of taxable sources: income tax, sales tax, flat benefit tax, as well as real estate taxes.

The ideal PFB taxing plan would allow school districts to select their own mix of taxing rates, which would reflect local financial and resource conditions.

The PFB would also:

- Seek a cap on property tax for schools.
- · Remove the current cap on earned income taxes with real property taxes being reduced proportionately;
- · Eliminate the personal property tax, the occupation tax assesment and local nuisance taxes;

 Establish tax credit rebates for property tax relief;

· Require taxing boards to receive voter approval for authority to raise or incur debt, beyond a fixed percentage of the tax base.

Its policy is also to have any tax reform proposal which would give tax relief to homesteads include resident farms with tax relief on the farm home and farm buildings.
