## Ag Land Preservation Board Approves 20 Easements

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) - The Agricultural Land Preservation Board recently approved easement purchases for 20 farms across the commonwealth.

Agriculture Secretary Samuel F. Haves Jr., who chairs the board. said, "Gov. Tom Ridge is committed to ensuring the strength of Pennsylvania agriculture through a vigorous farmland preservation program designed to protect our agricultural tradition."

Created in 1989, the Pennsylvania Agricultural Land Preservation Board is responsible for the oversight of the state Farmland Preservation Program.

The program allows the state and counties to purchase development rights, referred to as easements, to guarantee that farms will remain as agricultural land.

Including four county owned easements accepted most recently, the Farmland Preservation Program has protected 927 farms in 39 counties encompassing 117,934 acres.

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
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
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
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
