Delegate Ronald Guns, House Environmental Matters Committee chairman, will present his perspective on the recently passed Water Quality Act of 1998.

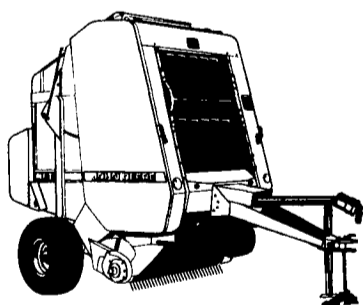
