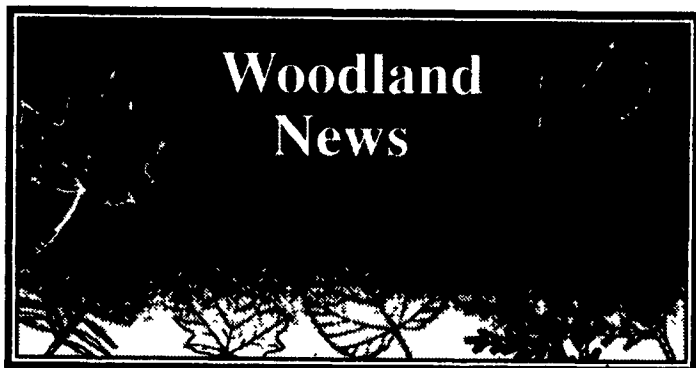
Appointed by AHI's nominating committee each year, the AHI board of directors decided on association policy or procedure recommendations.

AG FACULTY WELL ROOTED IN TREE KNOWLEDGE

Pennsylvania's forests have made an impressive comeback since the turn of the century, when the state was nearly denuded of trees. These days, homeowners and city planners are more aware of how trees enhance Pennsylvania's environment.

Faculty and extension specialists in Penn State's College of Agricultural Sciences can offer their expertise on a wide variety of tree-related topics ranging from pruning to landscaping.

The following experts would be effective sources on tree-related issues:

- Henry Gerhold, professor of forest genetics. He is an expert on tree genetics and Christmas tree breeding. Gerhold also is an expert on the selection of tree varieties for urban areas. His office number is (814) 865-3281.
