be registration at 8:30 a.m., training from 9:00-12:00 noon, lunch on your own from 12:00-1:00 p.m., and training from 1:00-4:00 p.m. The certification exam has been scheduled on Thursday July 9.. There is no fee to take the individual nutrient management
