Prices were unchanged to higher for the large sizes in the Southeast, Midwest, and Boston, and unchanged elsewhere. Prices were unchanged to lower for mediums in the Midwest, and unchanged elsewhere. All other prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady to firm for the large sizes, and no better than steady for light weights. Demand covered the full range and was mostly moderate with best movement into retail specials. Supplies continued close to adequate for the large sizes, and adequate to ample for light sizes. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate for the mixed demand, and light weight eggs remained readily available. Light type hen supplies were at least adequate for full schedules.
