NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE:  
 Prices were unchanged to lower for brown large in Boston, and all other prices were unchanged. The market tone was generally steady except for large in the Midwest and on the West Coast which was no better than steady. Demand covered the full range and was mostly moderate with best movement into features and resort areas. Supplies were adequate or available with the heaviest sizes still occasionally tight on the East Coast and in the North Central region. Breaking stock supplies were generally adequate for the mixed but mostly light to fair demand, and the trade sentiment was steady to fully steady in the Central region and steady in the East. Offerings of spent hens remained at least adequate for full slaughter schedules.

Trade sentiment was no better than steady. In the parts complex, breast items were fully adequate. Wings were adequate to barely adequate. Other items were in generally good balance.
