Demand very good from packers. Demand  
moderate for replacement cows and pairs.  
Total 420 cows and bulls sold with 60 per-

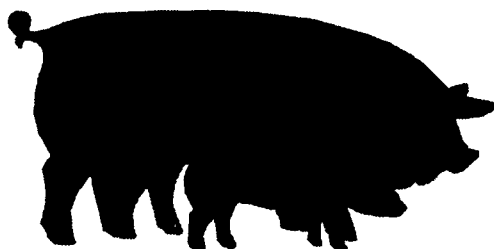
