Harvest pressure, good yields, and lack of export sales, weighed on wheat bids today. Corn and soybean bids continued higher on hot, dry weather predictions for the Midwest. Wheat mostly 1 to 3 cents lower. Corn 1 to 4 cents higher. Sorghum 5 cents higher. Soybeans 3 to 9 cents higher. Wheat harvest is moving rapidly northward with good yields reported. Bids were slightly lower as export demand this week remains slow. Very good export sales of corn over the past couple of days but not for soybeans. Forecasts are still calling for hot, dry conditions to move into the Midwest.

Compared to last week: Feeder cattle and calves steady. Demand good and improved from last week. Quality of supply average to mostly plain. Flesh conditions medium to thin with many cattle exhibiting stress of dry pasture conditions. Weigh conditions average to full. Slaughter cows steady to 1.00 lower. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand moderate. 400 cows and bulls sold with 70 percent to packers. Receipts this week 7,400; last week 11,093; last year 7,119. Supply consisted of 74 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 21 percent calves; 5 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
