IN BOSTON, EXTRA LARGE PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO TWO CENTS HIGHER, LARGE WERE UNCHANGED TO THREE CENTS HIGHER, AND MEDIUMS WERE UNCHANGED. PRICES IN NEW ENGLAND WERE THREE CENTS HIGHER FOR EXTRA LARGE AND LARGE, TWO CENTS HIGHER FOR MEDIUMS AND SMALLS, AND JUMBOS WERE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE

WAS FULLY STEADY TO FIRM. DEMAND WAS LIGHT TO GOOD, BET-TER INTO RESORT AREAS AND WHERE FETURES WERE IN PROG-RESS. SUPPLIES OF THE LARGER SIZES REMAINED TIGHT WHILE THE LIGHTER WEIGHTS WERE BARELY ADEQUATE TO ADEQUATE. BREAK-ING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE USUAL-LY ADEQUATE FOR THE LIGHT DEMAND.
