Grain and soybean bids spent another day on the down side as profit taking and continued good growing weather undermined bids. Wheat 1 to 9 cents lower. Corn steady to 4 cents lower. Sorghum 3 cents lower. Soybeans 8 to 11 cents lower. Moderate temperatures and scattered rainfall weighed on bids today. Forecasters are predicting more of the same over the next several days. Corn and soybean bids were also pushed lower by fund selling on the Board. Export sales are slow to come this week, however, a few wheat orders were reported overnight.
