BAKED APPLES & SAUSAGE

1 pound bulk sausage 6 tart apples ('Granny Smith' or other baking apple)

2 tablespoons brown sugar 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon grated lemon

rown the sausage in a skillet. Wash the ap-Deles and cut off the tops. Remove the cores

and hollow out the apples, leaving just a 1/2-inch thickness. Chop the removed apple flesh and mix with the browned sausage, brown sugar, cinnamon, and lemon rind. Fill the apples with the mixture, place into a baking dish, cover, and bake at 375° F until ten-

der, about 40 minutes. Makes 6 servings


