DELMARVA BROILER/FRYER MARKET. FEDERAL-STATE

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light and typical of midweek activity. Seller offerings remained in short supply on the heavier weights; fully adequate to ample on the smaller sizes. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were desirable to light. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 69 to 83 cents. Trade sentiment remained firm on the 3 pound and up sizes; barely steady to weak on the balance. In the parts complex, volumes and items varied from plant to plant, but supplies were fully sufficient for the light and unaggressive buying interest.

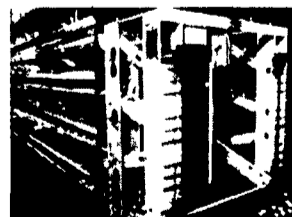

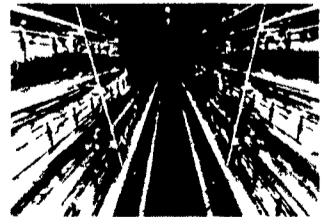
