LITITZ (Lancaster Co.) — In what was called a mini-farmshow by one of the participants, an estimated 1,000 people came to the two-day planting clinic Tuesday and Wedmesday, sponsored by Binkley & Hurst Bros., Inc., near Rothsville. New tractors and tillage equipment working in the fields, along with seminars and exhibits by supporting agribusinesses, drew this large crowd to the Case IH dealership. Lenord Hurst, owner, said the days were planned to help customers of the dealership.


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
