

## Troy Fair Features Open Colored Breed Shows

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TROY (Bradford County) — Nobledale Farms captured both the Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor banners at the Troy Fair Open Jersey Show, while Locust Lane Farm won both the Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Banners in the Open Ayrshire Show.

The Open Colored breed show, held Thursday, July 30, also included entries from the Brown Swiss, Guernsey and Milking Shorthorn breeds.

Overall the show, judged by Dave Castrogiovanni, of Montrose sported over 160 entries.

In the Jersey ring, the first place senior three year old, Topeco Sooner Jenny, owned by Tom and Phoebe Cole rose to the top to capture grand champion honors. She was followed by Blair and Cammy Yurkanin's Elm Brook Aerostar Velvet, a junior two year old, who earned the reserve grand champion ribbon.

From the heifer classes, fall calf Elm Brook SMV Velor, owned by Blair and Cammy Yurkanin was named the junior champion, while spring yearling Frosty Valley Luke Vienna,

owned by Daniel Harkness was named the reserve junior champion.

In the Ayrshire show, Amberleigh Yurkanin's five year old Laneway Festival's November, took the top spot and was named grand champion. Locust Lane Request Tulip, a four year old owned by Locust Lane Farm was named the reserve grand champion.

Tony Carter's Bonnie Brae Kimberlin was named the junior champion Ayrshire, while C.M. Ayrshires November's May, owned by Amberleigh Yurkanin was named the reserve junior champion.

Elm Brook Aytola Tonya, owned by John Yurkanin, was named the grand champion Brown Swiss. She was followed by Michael Cole's Victory Acres Legacy Alisi who took the reserve grand champion spot.

Amberleigh Yurkanin showed the junior champion Brown Swiss with Elm Brook Ice Jocelyn. Her winter calf was followed by John Yurkanin Jr's spring yearling, Elm Brook Signature Gifted

Two exhibitors made up the Guernsey show. Jamie Nealey's Mountain View Teardrop, a summer yearling, was named the jun-

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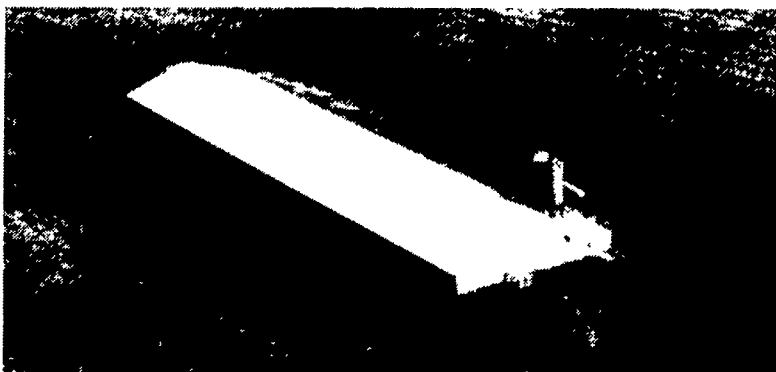
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
