THE MARKET TONE WAS STEADY TO FIRM WITH THE SMALLER SIZES IN THE STRONGEST POSITION. DEMAND RANGED LIGHT TO OCCASIONALLY GOOD, BETTER WHERE FEATURES WERE PRESENT AND IN RESORT AREAS. SUPPLIES OF LARGE SIZES WERE ADEQUATE

FEDERAL-STATE Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was generally slow. Seller offerings remained in short supply on the 3.5 to 4 pound sizes; fully adequate on the lighter weights. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mostly light to desirable. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 72 to 86 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, breast items were generally reported as fully adequate for immediate demand and often negotiable. Other items were at least adequate for the light and unaggressive buyer interest.

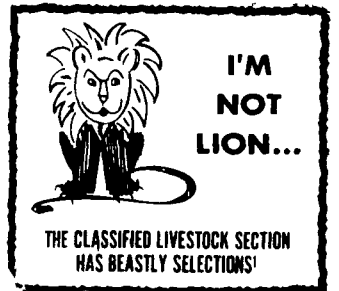
