Negative news continues to rule the grain and soybean trade but prices a little on the

positive side today. Wheat mixed. Corn steady to 2 cents higher. Sorghum 2 to 3 cents higher. Soybeans 2 to 8 cents higher.

Temperatures up near the century mark over a large part of the Corn Belt this week but this not expected to cut yields to any great extent as cooler weather and rain is in the forecast for next week. Corn harvest is already underway down South and the big feedlots in the Southwest are busy filling their huge storage pits with high moisture corn.

Good yields on the irrigated fields but not too great on some of the dry spots in the South and Southwest. Western and Eastern Corn Belts expected to have the abundant harvest. Good yields reported on early spring wheat harvest. Exports again showing a little activity, mostly for corn and soybeans. Many counties now have LDP payments for wheat.

Some out of the way country elevators that no longer have rail service are bidding below 1.70 a bushel for new crop corn. CCC loan rates of 2.00 on corn and 5.40 soybeans are popular in numerous counties. The Government may become big grain dealers this fall with tight storage space.
