Rutgers Extension Offers Timber Program

FLEMINGTON, N.J. — On August 27, at 6 p.m., Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Hunterdon County, New Jersey, is to conduct a twilight forestry program, "An In-the-woods, Up-Close-and-Personal Look at Timber Harvesting and Regeneration in a North Jersey Woodlot."

The program is to be conducted by Dr. Mark Vodak, forestry Extension specialist, with Rutgers.

Also involved are to be Win Cowgill, county agricultural Extension agent, and Mr. Duke Grimes, a consulting forester who manages the forest property to be toured.

The woodland is a mixed hardwood forest type common in northern New Jersey. The primary species are red oak, white oak, black oak, tulip poplar and ash.

At the time of harvest, the stand was well-stocked and mature. Sawtimber and veneer logs were the primary products harvested.

Since the harvest, management activities have also focused on successfully regenerating the next

forest.

Weeding and other timber stand improvement activities have been implemented to aid regeneration.

Additionally, participants can view and discuss the use of tree tubes for seedling protection as part of the overall regeneration strategy.

With the landowner's objectives in mind, the management activities implemented to date provide both income for the landowner and sustains the woodland as forested open space for future generations.

The advantages and disadvantages of these management practices will be discussed during the program. Participants can see for themselves what these practices are, what the results look like, and have the chance to ask questions.
