DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY

Sounds like a broken record but grain and soybean bids fell moderately lower today. Wheat 2 to 4 cents lower. Corn 4 to 9 cents lower. Sorghum 8 to 9 cents lower. Soybeans 1 to 10 cents lower. Wheat continued lower on harvest progress and good spring wheat yields are reported good. Favorable harvest weather up North, weighed on bids. Another fairly busy day for export sales with South Korea a big buyer. Corn and soybean bids moved sharply lower in reaction to very good crop conditions and beneficial growing weather. Some rain is forecast for the Midwest and Corn Belt areas but this would only benefit growth. Corn export demand has been good over the past couple of days, limiting declines.
