
Rep. Pitts Visits Farmers



Highland cattle originated in Scotland perhaps as early as the sixth century. Their genetics have remained basically unchanged through the year. They are especially noted for their hardiness. disease resistance, calving ease, mothering instincts, docile nature, browsing ability, thriftiness and longeity, with many cows calving into their late teens.


