LAST YEAR 2518 1679 CATTLE: Compared to last week's closing prices, slaughter steers sold steady to weak. The market's potential looked good early in the week, but by Thursday pressure loomed and prices slipped slightly lower in the face of the three-day weekend and reduced slaughter rates. Western feedlots lost yet another dollar this week with the bulk of sales posted at 56.00. However, cattle feeders will get little sympathy from hog producers as local hog prices dropped as much as 8.00 this week. Local Holstein steers closed .50-1.00 lower and heifers ended mostly steady in a light test. Slaughter cows finished .50-1.00 lower and slaughter bulls sold steady to .50 lower. This week's supply was made up of around 39 percent slaughter steers, 5 percent slaughter heifers, 37 percent slaughter cows, 6 percent bulls and the balance were feeder cattle.

Holstein Association **Offers IP, PC System**

BRATTLEBORO, Vt. - The TAG ID program has helped many producers get caught up on registrations and the Holstein Association has found another way to simplify the identification process by using on-farm PCS and EASY, the Electronic Application System.

Producers using EASY can simply mail the diskette or file transfer the Applications for Registration to the Holstein Association. EASY is an IBM-compatible software program (available in both DOS and Windows®) that electronically fills out Applications for Registration, then stores the information on disk. EASY can also read from several herd management systems such as PCDART, Dairy Comp, DHI Plus, etc., to peed up the identification process.

EASY 3.0, an upgrade to accommodate the American ID numbering system, is available and should be used for all future electronic registry applications. The new herdbook design with the Registered Holstein Ancestry (RHA) percent has been programmed to replace the IHF, Qualified and Registered levels. The new NAAB code number with the country codes is also incorporated in the program.

EASY for Windows runs on a 486SX-33 MHZ computer (minimum) with a minimum of 8 MB of RAM and a minimum of 2 MB of free hard disk space. The user has to have Windows 3.1, 3.11, Windows 95 or Windows NT installed to run EASY for Windows.
