may not think of her and her husband as farmers, but that they rely upon the soil and are agriculturally affiliated with the labor intensive business of operating 12 greenhouses.

The Ernst family raises 24,000 pointsettias, 10,000 geraniums, 2,500 mums, 3,000 azaleas, and 3,000 lilies.

Four outstanding youth also received awards and \$100 bonds for their commitment to agriculture and outstanding work in their particular field. These included two FFA members and two 4-H members.

Lynette Heffner and Josh Lawrey were selected for outstanding service by FFA advisers. Anita Manbeck and Brandon Treichler were selected by 4-H agents.

Lynette recently began studying food science at Penn State. She was graduated from Conrad Weiser High School, where she was active in FFA. Growing up on a farm, Lynette gradually took on more and more duties. At present she helps feed the calves, milk the herd, clip the udders, and body clip the 2-year-old cows.
