

Holstein Foundation Receives \$165,000 Challenge Grant

BRATTLEBORO, Vt. — The Holstein Foundation Board of Trustees has announced that William T. Graham, founder of World Dairy Center in Madison, Wisconsin, has generously pledged \$165,000 to the Holstein Foundation.

Mr. Graham's pledge is a matching challenge grant to encourage support from individuals, corporation, private foundations, and organizations for the Foundation's Dairy Bowl Contest and Young Dairy Leaders Institute.

Mr. Graham has pledged to match contributions on a 1:1 basis made to the Holstein Foundation for Dairy Bowl Contest up to a maximum of \$5,000 per year for three years (1998, 1999, 2000).

In addition, Mr. Graham has pledged to match contributions on a 1:1 basis made to the Holstein Foundation for Young Dairy Leaders Institute, up to a maximum of \$50,000 per year for three years.

"Mr. Graham's unprecedented generosity to the Holstein Foundation to support dairy youth and young adult education programs is a pivotal event in the advancement of the Holstein Foundation's work," says Obie Snider, chairman, Holstein Foundation Board of Trustees.

"Dairy youth and young adults need to develop the leadership and communication skills necessary to participate as full partners in addressing the issues facing rural American," he said. "Through his generous challenge pledge, Mr. Graham has helped to ensure that the Holstein Foundation's programming will continue and grow to develop future dairy leaders."

The Holstein Foundation's education, leadership development, and outreach programs serve youth and young adults working with all breeds of dairy cattle. Programs include

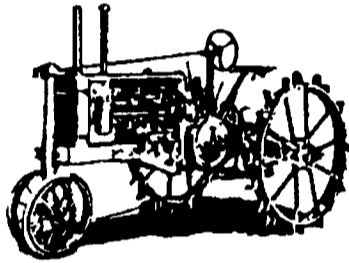
dairy bowl, program workbooks, a summer intern program, and Young Dairy Leaders Institute.
