Steers brought \$70,425; lambs, \$20,295 and swine, \$79,828 during the six hours of bidding.

Premier buyer Lincoln Supply and Equipment, which bought 12 animals during the sale for a total outlay of \$11,067, bought Lucas Svonavec's grand champion steer.

The 1,250-pound animal brought \$3.75 a pound for a total of \$4,687.50.

Svonavec, 16, is Rockwood.

Dr. Robert Bastian took the reserve champion steer, of Jason Fisher, Boswell, that weighed 1,215 pounds for a \$2 price tag, for a total of \$2,430.

The steer was also the county bred champion.

Jeffrey Knotts, Meyersdale, had the county bred reserve champion, which brought \$1,574, when purchased for Renaissance \$1.25 from Nutrition.
