

## Bucks County Announces 4-H Market Lamb Winners

DOYLESTOWN (Bucks Co.) — Alyssa Poorman, a 10-year-old from New Britain, showed her 112-pound Hampshire wether to the grand champion at the Bucks County 4-H Market Lamb Show and Sale.

Her lamb was purchased by W Rollin Raab & Son, Inc. of Hartsville for \$435.

Justin Brown of Hatfield had the reserve champion lamb. His 128-pound Suffolk was bought by Rosenberger's Dairy, Hatfield, for \$410.

Thirty-two 4-H members participated in the show and sale. The sale averaged \$220 per lamb.

Two lambs topped the sale at

\$475. Univest Corporation, Souderton, bought the second place heavy weight lamb, a 132-pound Suffolk owned by Kelly Pike of Quakertown. A group of buyers including Howard Simons, Newton Chanin, Hong Kong Jack's Restaurant, Hoot & Holler Farm and Manyunk Charcuterie also paid \$475 for Alyce Simons' second place medium heavyweight lamb.

Other class winners included Amber Glover, Pineville, first place lightweight which was bought by Keystone Farm Credit, Silverdale, for \$100. Tim Mann won the heavyweight division. The First National Bank of Newtown paid \$230 for his 139-pound Hampshire ewe.

## 4-H Swine Clubs Conduct 56th Annual Show, Sale

CHAMBERSBURG (Franklin County) — The 56th Annual Franklin County 4-H Pig Club Show and Sale was held at the Greencastle Livestock Market on Saturday, Aug. 1, with 73 4-H project animals shown and sold.

The 77 head of pork-on-the-hoof totaled 15,530 pounds and sold for a total sale value of \$13,901.05 or an average of 90 cents per pound.

The grand champion hog, weighing 245 pounds, was shown by Eric Diem, Willow Hill and was purchased by Hatfield Meats for \$3.10 a pound. The reserve champion shown by Adam Greenawalt of Amberson, weighing 230 pounds, was also purchased by Hatfield Quality Meats for \$1.30 a pound.

In the pen-of-two class, champion honors went to Eric Diem, Willow Hill, and was purchased by Hatfield Quality Meats for \$1 a pound. Reserve champion honors went to Justin Conner, Chambersburg, purchased by Upperman's Water Treatment Service and Rotz

& Stonesifer Public Accountants for \$1 a pound.

In the junior fitting and showing class, Anna Kent, St. Thomas, was declared grand champion and

Jonathan Wenger, Newburg, was reserve champion.

In the senior division, Justin

Conner was declared grand champion and Jordon Conner, Chambersburg, was reserve champion.

The show was judged by Nelson Beam, who has a 210-sow operation in Chester County.

Roundup trophies were sponsored by York Farm Credit, ACA of Chambersburg and ribbons and rosettes were provided by the Franklin County 4-H Development Fund.
