Trust Names New Development Director

LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) — Thomas D. Stouffer, executive director of Lancaster Farmland Trust, announced that Kenneth M. Ebert, director of development at Delone Catholic High School, has been named the Trust's new director of development effective Sept. 21.

The Director of Development is a professional staff position of Lancaster Farmland Trust, reports directly to the executive director, and is responsible for all development activities. Ebert will have overall responsibility for major gift fundraising, grants development, membership development, special events, education and community outreach, marketing, product sales, and public relations.

Ebert, whose paternal and maternal family is originally

from the city of Lancaster, joins the trust with more than five years experience in agricultural retail from managing New Oxford Agway and Supply in New Oxford. His grandparents, Anthony and Agnes Colatta, were long-time stand holders at Lancaster Central Market until their retirement in the early 1980s.

He is also a member of The Friends of the Central Market, a local support organization dedicated to preserving and marketing the historic farmer's market in downtown Lancaster. Ebert is a graduate of Lehigh University in Bethlehem. In his previous position he was responsible for communications with more than 8,000 alumni and an Annual Fund Campaign that increased by almost 500 percent during his four-year tenure.

New Ag Publications Available

NEWARK, Del. — Whether you are seeking environmentally sound ways to manage farm waste or advice on commercial perennial plant production, agricultural producers need up-to-date, research-based information.

Researchers from the University of Delaware help produce publications like the following, available by mail order from the Northeast Regional Agricultural Engineering Service (NRAES).

The Guideline for Dairy Manure Management from Barn to Storage is a 36-page guide that covers the planning or improvement of manure-handling systems; regulations; manure characteristics and production; alternatives for manure management; options for transferring manure from barn to storage; and manure storage types and storage management.

Guideline for Milking Center Wastewater discusses topics such as wastewater characteristics and estimating the amount of waste produced; source control of milking center wastewater; the milking center drainage system; and treatment alternatives such as liquid

manure system, short-term storage, land application and settling tanks. Safety and health concerns are also summarized.

Herbaceous Perennials Production: A Guide from Propagation to Marketing is a comprehensive information source that considers situations encountered by growers in businesses of all sizes. The 220-page book, which focuses on production, contains information

about taxonomy, nomenclature, plant hardiness, the physical needs of crops, irrigation systems and cutting-edge research on perennial propagation and production.

MDA to Run Aflatoxin Tests

ANNAPOLIS, Md. — Maryland Secretary of Agriculture Henry A. Virts announced recently that the Maryland Department of Agriculture will offer free aflatoxin tests for farmers worried about drought stress on their 1998 corn crops.

"Last year we offered such help in response to drought. Here again in 1998, farmers are faced with possible loss due to an odd combination of drought stress on corn coupled with moisture at the wrong time and

aflatoxin mold spores," Virts said.

Aflatoxin is a mold which can infest corn grown under the stress of drought and heat. Badly contaminated corn is dangerous if fed to livestock, particularly poultry. Maryland first experienced aflatoxin problems in corn as a result of a drought in 1983.

Farmers interested in the aflatoxin testing program should contact their county extension service office for details.
