Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained fairly good; however, inquiry for additional product had slowed significantly at some points. Seller offerings were adequate to short and were in the closer balance on the smaller sizes. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights varied, but were generally heavier than desired. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 67 to 81 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to firm. In the parts complex, wings were short of a good demand. Breast items were irregularly available. Leg quarters were in heavy supply and were slow in clearing.
