Pennsylvania Farmers Union Urges Measures To Boost Livestock Market

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — For the region's financially strapped livestock producers, two key measures before Congress would provide a badly needed boost, State President Robert Junk said.

The proposals, to require price reporting on all livestock sales and the labeling of imported meat, will help make the market more fair and competitive for the nation's producers.

Mandatory price reporting

will help and end anti-competitive practices that have kept prices low for producers. Nearly 80 percent of red meat processing nationwide is controlled by just three multinational firms. And, despite precipitous drops in the prices of live animals, consumer prices for meat have remained constant.

"Mandatory price reporting will help end secret deals in the livestock industry that drive prices down," said Robert Junk. "Producers, like anyone else selling a product, deserve full information in order to make sound, market driven business decisions. Without price transparency, the buyer rules and the seller gets a low price. That is by no means a fair, free or competitive market."

The second measure will require "domestic" or "imported" labels on most beef and lamb

products. Meat produced in the U.S. meets the most rigorous health standards in the world. Labeling will give consumers, who have invested in our food safety system, the right to choose U.S. produced meat.

"U.S. producers provide the safest food supply in the world, and we're proud of it. Labeling will allow consumers to support that proud tradition," Robert Junk said.

Producers should call their senators and member of Congress and ask them to support mandatory price reporting and country-of-origin labeling. ALFRED, N.Y. — Joan Wissert, assistant professor and chair, Agriculture and Horticulture Department, Alfred State College, was recently named to the Advisory Council of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALS) for Cornell University's College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. She will serve a three-year term.

The CALS Advisory Council provides advice and counsel on broad matters of policy and planning to the deans and directors of the college. Forty Council members offer input on the college's programs and on local and state needs.

Council members are selected based on their expertise and experience and on their capability in representing one or more of the six major programs of the college. The six areas include agriculture community, human and rural resources, environment and natural resources, food and nutrition, international programs, and life sciences.
