Grain and soybean bids finished mostly lower, today, due to trade corrections and light export demand. Wheat steady to 4 cents lower except Portland 2 to 3 cents higher. Corn 1 to 5 cent lower. Sorghum 2 to 3 cents lower. Soybeans 4 to 18 cents lower. Wheat bids were mostly lower after two days of higher trends. Small overnight export sales limited declines. Corn and soybean bids fell due to lack of foreign demand and active harvest. Increased movement of old crops stocks and limited US crusher demand added to weakness.

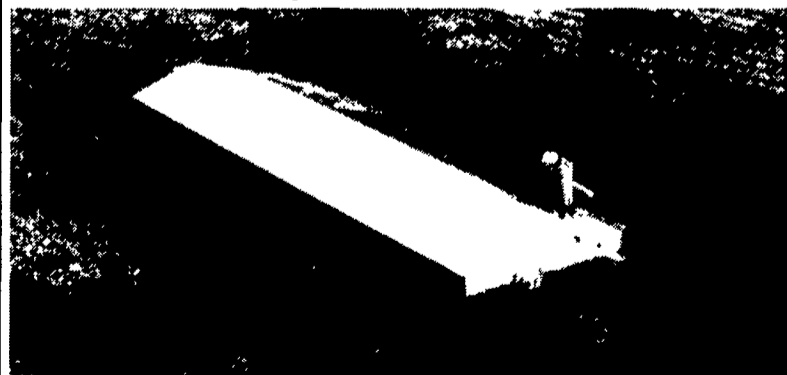
