Wheat traded mostly lower with pressure stemming from profit taking on the Board. However, excellent overnight export sales tempered declines. Corn and soybean bids were lower on fund selling, lack of new foreign demand, and harvest pressure from corn. Wheat mostly 1 to 10 cents lower except Portland 5 cents higher. Corn 1 to 2 cents lower. Sorghum 1 cent lower. Soybeans 2 to 8 cents lower. Rains have stopped most places in the Corn belt and farmers are back in the fields. Good yields have been reported for corn but storage is still a big problem. There is still some old crop beans being cleaned out in preparation for new crop.

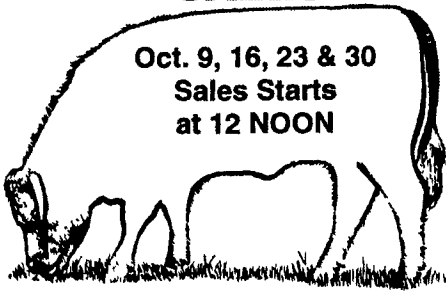
