How Do You Remove Smoke, Mildew Odors?

Odors from smoke or mildew often become trapped in textiles, making them impossible to remove by normal cleaning techniques. Most of these odors, however, can be removed by your drycleaner through the use of ozone generators.

Ozone is formed through a process called oxidation, which causes the material with which the oxygen is combined to chang its molecular configuration by losing one or more if its electrons.

Ozone generators work by passing dry air through a high frequen-

cy electrical field. This electrical discharge splits an oxygen molecule into two free atoms, which then combine with an oxygen molecule that has not been split to form ozone. The contact between ozone and the odors embedded in the textiles causes oxidation to reoccur, resulting in elimination of the odors and release of oxygen.
