

Frederick Farm Museum To Hold Celebration

FREDERICK, Md. — Come out and join the Farm Museum to celebrate Frederick County, Maryland's 250th anniversary.

The Farm Museum will showcase a variety of farm equipment from the horse-drawn era through the modern-day machines working the fields every day. Visitors will have the opportunity to see an old-fashioned butchering on Saturday morning, October 3. The butchering also serves as a fund-

raiser to the Museum, with the fresh pork to be sold to the public.

Also on Saturday the Central Maryland Antique Tractor Club will hold an antique tractor pull at 10 a.m. Sunday starts with a pedal tractor pull for the kids at 12:30 p.m. For those who pride themselves on their baking ability the 21st annual Francis Crum Memorial Cake contest will take place on Sunday, with judging at 12:30 p.m. and the auction at 2 p.m. The auction is another fund-raiser for

the museum.

Throughout the weekend a saw-mill will be in operation, powered by a steam engine. Wheat threshing will also take place both days. Additional weekend activities include hay rides, craft demonstrations, sales, farm life displays, farm animals, and antique farm equipment.

For the children there will be games and activities. The Children's Museum at Rose Hill Manor Park will present "Craft Ways." Children will have hands-on opportunities to dip candles, make soap, and experience cooking on the open hearth. Visitors can tour the historic mansion that served as the home of Maryland's first Governor, Thomas Johnson.

Entertainment includes the Harmony Coronet Band on Saturday, and the Gospel Travelers on Sunday. As always visitors will be treated to the homestyle foods and fresh baked pies at the Farm Museum food stands.

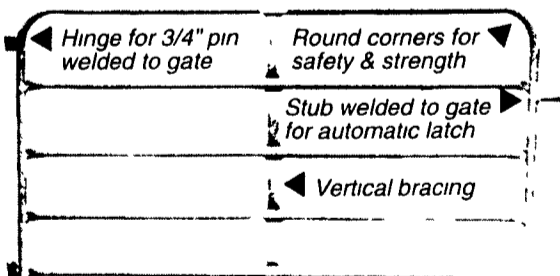
