For us mere mortals, the sapphire was supposed to help gain favor with the gods Pope Innocent II had these stones set in all his bishops' rings The gem was also considered a hedge against unchastity and evil.

CAPE BRETON CREAMED CABBAGE

1 small cabbage salt and pepper, to taste 2 tablespoons vinegar 2 tablespoons butter 1 egg 1 cup cream

Tut up cabbage and steam until tender (under 10 Uminutes). Drain, then season with salt, pepper, vinegar, and butter. Beat egg and cream, and stir into the cabbage mixture, reheating briefly to just warm. Do not boil!


