Oklahoma National Stockyards - Weekly Cattle Summary

Compared to last week: Feeder steers steady to 1.00 lower; feeder heifers 1.00-2.00 lower. Steer and heifer calves 1.00-3.00 lower. Demand rather light for calves as many northern buyers have returned home for their own calf runs. Fall and early winter wheat pasture will be limited and this further narrowing calf outlets. Demand fairly good for feeder steers, light for heifers. Quality average with a few attractive calves. Weigh-ups average. Slaughter cows 3.00 lower. Slaughter bulls 2.00 lower. Packer demand light. Demand remains good for thin cows returning to the country. Total of 1,270 cows and bulls sold with 51 percent to packers. ** Special Stock Cow sale Oct 3 starts 1:00 P.M. 1,500-2,000 expected ** Receipts this week 11,723; last week 12,006; last year 10,321. Supply consisted of 49 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 40 percent calves under 600 lbs; 11 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.

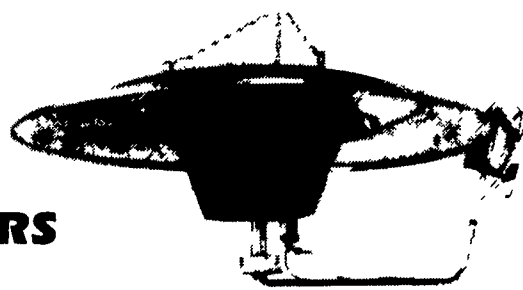
