Reserve champion went to last year's grand champion of the show, Patrick Good. Patrick, 19, is the son of Amos and Pat Good, Lititz. He showed a crossbred gilt. Judge Nelson Beam enjoyed the overall leanness of the hog, "just a real complete pig." he said.


