Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light and unaggressive. Seller offerings remained readily available and were slow in clearing on the 3 pound and heavier sizes; lighter weights were in fairly good balance. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 62 to 76 cents. Trade sentiment was weak. In the parts complex breast items were in excess and difficult to place. Leg items were fully sufficient for current inquiry. Wings were available and competitively priced to stimulate buyers
