Prices were unchanged. The market tone remained steady. Demand covered the full range, was mostly fair, and was best where featured. Supplies were mostly adequate, but brown eggs and jumbos were tight in some areas. Breaking stock supplies were mixed, and generally adequate for the light to fair demand; the market tone was steady. Light type hen supplies were adequate for full plant schedules.

DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY
Grain and soybean trade was slow today and bids mostly lower. Wheat mixed. Corn 2 to 6 cents lower. Sorghum 5 cents lower. Soybeans 6 to 19 cents lower. Good overnight export wheat sales offered some strength to bids. However, beneficial rains in hard red winter wheat growing areas limited gains, despite the slowdown in winter wheat planting. Corn bids continued to decline due to lack of fresh export sales this week, rapid harvest progress, and very good yields. Rainfall in the Midwest slowed harvest in some areas this week. Traders expected USDA to lower their carryover estimate in today's stock report but

figures remained within 25 million bushels. Taiwan bought a substantial amount of soybeans overnight.

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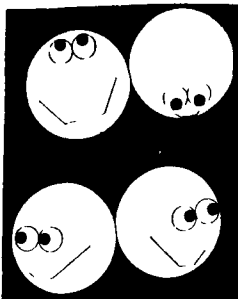
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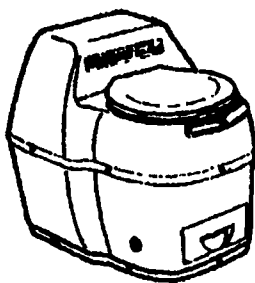
