Com bids continued to decline due to lack of fresh export sales this week, rapid harvest progress, and very good yields. Rainfall in the Midwest slowed harvest in some areas this week. Traders expected USDA to lower their carryover estimate in today's stock report but

figures remained within 25 million bushels. Taiwan bought a substantial amount of soybeans overnight.






