## **IRISH POTATO BISCUITS**

6 to 8 potatoes 1 cup milk or cream 1 tablespoon melted butter sait, to taste 1/2 cup flour (approximately)

Boil and mash the potatoes, making sure they are free of lumps. Add the milk, butter, and salt. Add just enough flour to make a soft dough, then lay it on a floured board and roll out quickly and lightly to a half-inch sheet. Cut into rounds; bake about 10 minutes, or until just crisp on the outside Butter and eat before they fall.
