DELMARVA BROILER/FRYER MARKET. FEDERAL-STATE

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to fair at best. Offerings were adequate to fully adequate and remained in fairly good balance. Live supplies were moderate; weights varied in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 60 to 74 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate for current inquiry. Breast cuts were in heaviest balance. Leg quarters and wings were fully adequate to ample with machine cut wings in the longer position.

Prices were higher for whites, unchanged to higher for whole, and unchanged on the balance. The market tone was firm for whites, and steady to fully steady on other items.

Demand was fair to good, mostly moderate. Supplies were about adequate. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending September 26, 1998 were 4% higher than last week, and 3% higher than the same week last year. Raw material offerings decreased under a steady to fully steady trade sentiment.

Supplies of extra-large were adequate to instances fully adequate, large were adequate to ample, and mediums were no more than adequate.

Large and extra-large prices were unchanged to lower in the Northeast, Southeast, and Midwest, and unchanged elsewhere.

Medium prices were unchanged to higher in the Northeast and Southeast, and unchanged elsewhere. The market tone was steady to weak for the large sizes, and steady to firm for mediums and smalls. Demand remained mixed from light to instances good, mostly moderate, and was best where featured. Supplies were adequate to ample for graded large, and ranged barely adequate to fully adequate for other sizes. Inquiry for breaking stock was light to moderate, and regular supplies of shell eggs were usually adequate, but an occasional plant sought extra eggs. Light type hen supplies remained at least adequate.
