DELMARVA BROILER/FRYER MARKET. FEDERAL-STATE

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was slow to fair and often noted as disappointing for the first of the month. Offerings were fully adequate to ample although sizes continued to vary from plant to plant. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed in a full range of light to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 58 to 72 cents. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak. In the parts complex, wings were generally held with increased confidence. Breast items, particularly bone-in had increased in availability

ty and were difficult to place. Other items were fully adequate to ample.

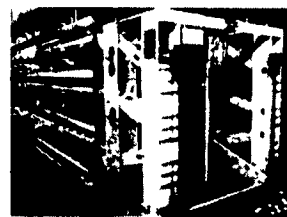

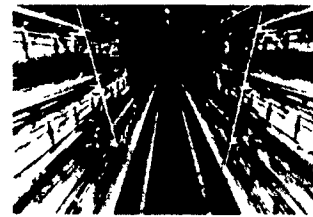
