Compared to last week: Steer calves steady to 2.00 lower, decline over 500 lbs. Heifer calves 1.00-2.00 lower. Feeder cattle steady in a light test. Supply continues mostly calves and very few yearlings. Demand moderate. Several sets of calves in thin condition with many in average flesh. This not typical of a normal fall run in which calves are fleshy but the summer drought stressed cows causing farmers to wean calves early. Quality plain to average, few attractive. Rains of 2-6 inches fell over the weekend with heaviest rains and flooding along I-40 and northward. Slaughter cows 1.00-2.00 higher. Slaughter bulls 2.00 higher. Packer demand good for light receipts. Demand remains good for thin cows destined to feedlots or returning to country. Total of 485 cows and bulls sold with 45 percent going to packers. Receipts this week 8,900; last week 14,860; last year 14,516. Supply consisted of 31 percent yearlings and calves over 600 lbs; 64 percent calves under 600 lbs; 5 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.




