The dinner will be held from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. in the magnificently renovated Lincoln Plaza Hotel, Reading's most recent preservation triumph, in the Presidential Ballroom. The hotel is located at Fifth & Washington Streets, Reading.

The speaker is the Honorable William A. Johnson, Jr., mayor of Rochester, N.Y. Johnson has received national attention for his dynamic leadership. Elected to office in 1994, he has tackled the big issues head on and is making remarkable progress.

Johnson made accessible government one of his top priorities, interacting with a broad crosssection of community residents from school children to senior citizens, corporate executives to the unemployed. By making more than 3,000 public appearances throughout the region, he has opened lines of communication and generated grassroots support.

He had concentrated on areas deemed most critical to improving the quality of life for city residents: education, economic development, public safety, human services, and regional cooperation. His Neighbors Building Neighborhoods program has stimulated affordable housing development, and his business and employment programs have resulted in nearly \$100 million being invested and more than 1,000 new jobs being cited in the past two years.

At a regional level, he is trying to address sprawl and encourage "smart growth" in Greater Rochester and the surrounding counties, including the nearby Finger Lakes district, an nationally important agricultural area. He personally visits every community that invites him, presenting his slide show on sprawl, and promoting regional solutions. "The global economy is putting all of us cities, suburbs, and villages on the same team" he said. "It's time for Greater Rochester to play the game to win."

The meeting agenda includes the annual election of officers and new board members, and a number of featured award presentations. 
