DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY
 Grain and soybean bids finished higher as wheat and corn advanced due to overnight export demand and soybean bids received support from higher meal and oil trade. Wheat 2 to 7 cents higher. Corn 1 to 5 cents higher. Sorghum 4 to 8 cents higher. Soybeans 2 to 5 cents higher. Although South Korea bought only a small amount of US wheat overnight, traders anticipate 1.3 million tonnes of US wheat donations. Higher corn and bean bids also underpinned wheat bids. Good export sales of corn to South Korea overnight. Additional support came from indications that South Korea is likely to accept one billion dollars in US credits for grain. Harvest pressure kept a lid on gains. Soybean bids followed the higher trends with strength from soyoil and soybean meal demand. The USDA forecasted a cut to India's bean crop of .4 million tonnes, this also offered support. Continued harvest pressure but corn and bean harvest nearly complete.
