Soybean bids regained some of yesterday's losses on indications that soybean planting in parts of Brazil has been halted by dry weather. This could reduce their 98-99 production estimate. 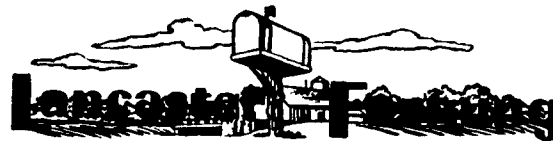

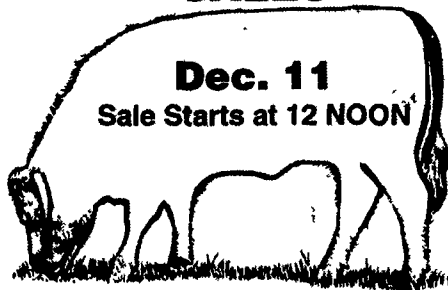
