ADA/DC Directors Approve 1999 Budget


LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) American Dairy Council Middle Atlantic (ADA/DC Middle Atlantic) Board of Directors voted unanimously to approve 1999 program plans and budget. During last week's annual budget meeting, ADA/DC unveiled aggressive plans to increase dairy product demand in the Middle Atlantic region.

In 1999, ADA/DC will extend Diary Management, Inc. (DMI) national programs to Middle Atlantic consumers. ADA/DC's plans to include more localized and extensive advertising, communications, and nutrition education programs building on DMI's plans. Both DMI and ADA/DC initiatives will primarily target children ages 3-12 and their moms.

To reach consumers locally, ADA/DC will develop regional food publicity campaigns such as a cheese carving contest in Harrisburg and a cheese recipe contest targeting Washington, D.C. chefs. More communitybased nutrition marketing programs such as museum exhibits and pre-school puppet shows will target educators and health professionals. ADA/DC will also launch an extensive project to improve milk's position in the retail arena. Other plans include increasing support for dairy princesses and capitalizing in the long-term relationship milk has with Middle Atlantic baseball teams. Building on existing nutrition education and advertising projects, these plans create a more integrated checkoff program to increase dairy demand. Board members commended

ADA/DC staff for bringing the new organization's plans together so quickly after the merger.
