Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds increased slightly at some plants, but overall movement remained light. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights varied in a full range of light to heavy, mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 54 to 68 cents. Trade sentiment was barely steady with some improvements noted for late week. In the parts complex, wings continued to clear well. Other items were fully adequate to ample.
