Supplies were at least adequate as most plants ran reduced holiday schedules this week. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending December 19, 1998 were 8% less than last week, and 2% less than the same week last year.

DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY

Grain and soybean bids finished near steady, today, after lower trends earlier. Wheat steady to 3 cents higher. Corn steady to 1 cent lower. Sorghum 4 cents higher to 1 cent lower. Soybeans 1 to 3 cents higher. Wheat bids were slightly higher as traders expect USDA to tender soon for the Russian aid package. Bitter cold temperatures are forecast this week across the US causing concern over winterkill in winter wheat areas. Corn bids were narrowly mixed as traders anticipate today's USDA Hog and Pig report which was positive. Some weakness was noted as export demand remained slow and farmer selling picked up slightly. Soybean bids were slightly higher as crude oil prices moved upward.
