n January 7, "neither work nor play," says the old proverb, but the women were expected to get back to their spinning on this first day following Epiphany and the holidays. A distaff is the staff that holds the flax



or wool in spinning. It came to symbolize the domestic sphere in general, and "the distaff side" meant the woman's side of the family.

Distaff Day was also called Rock Day, the rock indicating a weight for holding the spinning fleece taut as it was

being twisted into yarn. Interestingly, Plough Monday, the first Monday after Epiphany (January 11, this year) was when men were supposed to resume work, giving them extra days off.
